Additionally, the speakers will also be invited to explore how technology can support regional cooperation and the harmonization of policies so as to better connect Greater Caribbean countries and to connect the region to the rest of the world. The addresses would also acknowledge challenges, such as infrastructure gaps, cybersecurity concerns, and resistance to digital adoption, while stressing the need for capacity building and cross-sector collaboration.
